



GB Snowsport Summary of Anti-Doping Activities

2025/26 Season

1. General Summary

Over the 2025-26 season, GB Snowsport (GBS) have continued to commit time and resource into Clean Sport. Fifty-eight athletes and forty-three athlete support personnel (ASP) have been supported by GBS in completing approved anti-doping education between April 2025 and March 2026. Alongside formal education, GBS have been spreading and sharing Anti-Doping knowledge across the Snowsport community.

In June 2025, the GBS Anti-Doping Lead (ADL) role transitioned to Claire Williams, GBS Performance Support Lead (PSL). The Performance Support Lead provides strategic leadership, coordination and oversight of all sport science and sports medicine services, ensuring integrated and high-quality performance support for all GBS Olympic and Paralympic World Class Programme (WCP) athletes.

GBS athletes have been subject to UKAD testing process this season, and there have been no Adverse Analytical Findings (AAFs) or Anti-Doping Rule Violations (ADRVs) filed against anyone in the organisation. GBS continued to maintain full compliance with UKAD's Assurance Framework.

2. Monitoring and Evaluation

GBS Educators have continued to deliver tailored education to athletes. This Compete Clean+ education has targeted mandatory athletes across the World Class Programme, included those on National and GBS Squads and those on the long list to compete at the Olympic and Paralympic Games. Athletes and their athlete support personnel (ASP) (and parents, where necessary) have also been signposted to online UKAD training.

In addition, to be eligible to travel to the Milano Cortina Winter Olympic and Paralympic Games, individual team members were required to complete two parts of anti-doping education within the last two years from the end date of the Games:

1. Approved anti-doping education. GBS confirmed and supported the education of 86 (Olympic) and 41 (Paralympic) GBS individuals (athletes and ASP)
2. Pre-event education, which was an online workshop delivered by UKAD National Trainers and supported by GBS ADL. GBS supported the attendance of 64 (Olympic) and 38 (Paralympic) GBS individuals (athletes and ASP).

UKAD's online Clean Sport Hub has also proved useful for athletes and ASP to undertake education in their own time, and to access resources to keep their knowledge up to date as and when required. Education attendance data for both athletes and ASP have been collated and recorded, as per the UKAD's Assurance Framework requirement.

The GBS Board continue to prioritise the importance of fostering a culture of clean sport, with Board members attending UKAD's NGB Board Anti-Doping Lead Forums across November 2025.

Further anti-doping lead forums are scheduled for early May 2026, which will be attended by GBS ADL and will include an introduction from UKAD's Chair, Simon Lewis and Chief Executive, Jane Rumble, along with a summary of the key changes coming into effect from January 2027 through the revised World Anti-Doping Code and International Standards. Information from these forums will be shared across the Snowsport community over the summer ahead of the 2026-2027 season.

The GBS ADL utilised, where relevant, UKAD's additional education sessions. A relevant example included "Clean Sport Live with Sue Backhouse - Reducing the risk of inadvertent ADRVs from supplement use;" the information from which was then disseminated through the Compete Clean+ athlete sessions and Milan Cortina Preparation Team calls.

3. Compliance

UKAD's Annual Submission allows NGBs to show their continued compliance with the Assurance Framework. After obtaining full Assurance Framework compliance in 2025, GB Snowsport has continued to complete the Annual Submission ahead of UKAD's deadline. At the time of writing, UKAD are reviewing these submissions.

4. Testing

GBS had a total of twenty-five individual athletes on FIS and UKAD testing pools this season, across ten different Snowsport disciplines (one athlete is included in two pools).

According to UK Anti-Doping Testing Programme, GBS athletes have been tested at least seventy-seven times this year. The total number is likely to be significantly higher than this, as the Q4 period covers the majority of the Snowsport competition season (including the Olympic and Paralympic Games). No Adverse Analytical Findings (AAFs) or Anti-Doping Rule Violations (ADRVs) have been filed against GBS athletes during this time.

Additional testing was also conducted by other organisations during competition, including Olympic and Paralympic Games, World Cups, and the Junior World Championships.

GBS have worked to support athletes with a complex medical history to obtain Therapeutic Use Exemptions to support their health condition, in order to take part on the World Cup circuit and at Major Events.

5. Media & Communications

GBS have continued to show a public commitment to anti-doping through World Class Programme activity, athlete newsletters, GBS Athletes' Code of Conduct and GBS Clean Sport Strategy (<https://gbsnowsport.com/anti-doping/>).

GBS incorporated Clean Sport information into pre-Olympic and pre-Paralympic Games media briefings and highlighted additional anti-doping resources. GBS actively encouraged all athletes and team members to download the UKAD 100% me app on their personal devices and demonstrated full support for national initiatives, including UKAD's annual Clean Sport Week campaign.

UKAD Clean Sport Week 2026 will focus on a "built not bought, 100% me" and will run from 11th to 17th May. GBS will participate in UKAD Clean Sport Week through communication during the dedicated period.
